Subj: OPERATIONAL RISK MANAGEMENT (ORM) PROGRAM

1. Purpose. To establish policies, responsibilities and procedures for administration of the VAW/VRC Community Operational Risk Management program.

2. Cancellation. COMACCLOGWINGINST 3500.0C.

3. Background

a. An overarching goal of the U.S. Navy is to develop an environment in which every individual (officer, enlisted and civilian) is trained and motivated to personally manage risk in everything they do, both on and off duty, in peacetime and during conflict. This will drive the successful completion of operations and activities, with the minimum amount of risk.

b. Operational Risk Management (ORM) shall be incorporated through leadership, accountability and integrity. Leaders at all levels are responsible for ensuring proper procedures are in place and appropriate resources are available. Only through open communication and establishing the proper command climate can ORM become effective.

4. Discussion. ORM is a method to identify hazards, assess risks, and implement controls to reduce the risk associated with any operation. A thorough working knowledge of reference (a) is essential to implementing orientation and training programs for all personnel, as well as practicing ORM at all levels within individual commands and at home. The procedures contained herein

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are intended to standardize all VAW and VRC operations that are not specifically outlined in reference (a). These procedures shall remain valid unless superseded by higher authority.

5. Responsibilities. The following ORM program responsibilities are established and shall be conducted as outlined below:

a. Squadron Commanding Officer. Designate, in writing, the Executive Officer as the ORM Program Manager.

b. Squadron Executive Officer. Oversee command ORM training and implementation. Ensure one officer and one senior enlisted member, at a minimum, are qualified and designated as ORM Assistants per enclosure (1). Per reference (a), ORM Assistant qualification is earned by completing the OPNAV sponsored two-day enlisted/officer Application and Integration Course or graduation from Aviation Safety Officer or Aviation Safety Command course.

c. Squadron ORM Assistants. Train command personnel in the application of ORM Principles per reference (a) and assign responsibilities for ORM to appropriate supervisors when warranted. ORM Training shall include but not be limited to:

(1) Command specific ORM orientation upon check-in.

(2) Periodic refresher ORM training on the five-step ORM Process as deemed necessary by the Command ORM Program manager.

(3) Annual in-depth, scenario-based training on ORM process implementation for command member. This training is valid for 12 months from the last day of the month in which the current ground training was conducted. Personnel who fail to meet the annual, in depth, scenario based ORM training requirement without a written extension shall not serve as aircrew (Pilot, NFO, Naval Aircrewman) members. Once the annual ORM requirement is met, or an extension is approved, aircrew duties may be resumed. Command orientation, annual, and refresher training completion or extension authorization shall be recorded in the individual's NATOPS flight personnel training/qualification jacket using enclosure 2 of this instruction. Commanding Officers may grant written extension to the ORM expiration date for aircrew members that would otherwise expire during long deployments. Extensions shall not exceed 90 days after return from deployment.

(4) Navy Knowledge Online (NKO) is a one time qualification used to comply with reference (a) ORM training

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requirements. Completion of the NKO ORM course Individual- Managing Your Risk CPPD-ORM-MYR-1.0 is mandatory for all hands upon checking into a new command, or triennially. Completion of the NKO Assistant- Leading Risk Management Integration (CPPD-ORM-LRMI-1.0) is mandatory for all designated ORM Assistants. Supervisors- Managing your Team's Risk (CPPD-ORM-MYTR-1.0) course is mandatory for all E-7 and above, all Aircrew, and all Workcenter Supervisors. Manager- Directing Your Command's Risk Management (CPPD-ORM-DYCRM-1.0) is mandatory for all Department LCPOs and all O-5 and above. Additionally, GMT training is required annually. This training can be satisfied by completing the NKO ORM Course Time Critical Risk management (CPPD-TCRM09-01), at a command Safety Standdown, or by other methods listed in reference (a) and filed accordingly in each individual's ORM Training Record (Enclosure (2) of this instruction).

d. ORM Model Managers. VAW-120 Aviation Safety Officer is designated as the VAW/VRC Community Officer ORM Model Manager, and VAW-120 Safety Leading Chief Petty Officer is designated as the VAW/VRC Community Enlisted ORM Model Manager. The ORM Model Managers will provide program guidance, conduct continuous reviews of all associated publications to identify and resolve conflicts. ORM Model Managers shall be qualified and designated as ORM Assistants.


e. Assistant ORM Model Managers. COMACCLOGWING directs the Commanding Officer of VAW-120 to designate the community E-2C Pilot and NFO Model Managers and C-2A Pilot and Aircrew Model Managers as Assistant ORM Model Managers utilizing enclosure (1). Assistant ORM Model Managers shall work closely with the ORM Model Managers to provide fleet ORM program guidance. They will conduct Squadron assist visits during all unit NATOPS evaluations, providing guidance to Commanding Officers regarding the status of their ORM programs and offer advice on program improvement. Assistant ORM Model Managers should be qualified as ORM Assistants.

6. Changes. COMACCLOGWING shall be the lead for incorporating changes and promulgating revisions to this instruction. Change recommendations should be submitted to COMACCLOGWING Safety via the ORM Model Managers, utilizing enclosure (3). Addendums will be produced by COMACCLOGWING and forwarded to all commands.

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NOTE: This instruction shall be reviewed for recommended changes in conjunction with the annual VAW/VRC NATOPS conference. All recommended changes shall be forwarded IAW enclosure (3).

7. Action. All COMACCLOGWING personnel shall become familiar with this instruction. If guidance provided by higher authority conflicts with this instruction, the more stringent guidelines will apply until addendums can be forwarded.
