LOCAL TRAVEL INFORMATION FOR ARRIVING/DEPARTING PERSONNEL

If you're flying into/out of SEATAC Airport and need a ride to/from the Everett area, make arrangements ahead of time; either with your command, your sponsor, a friend or one of the commercial shuttles. The two main shuttle services are:

Shuttle Express: [1(800)487-7433 in Washington State only] or (206)622-1424, < <http://www.shuttleExpress.com> > will drop you off at the Everett Base Main Gate (2000 West Marine View Drive, Everett, 98207), Navy Lodge or Navy Gateway Inns and Suites (13910 45th Ave NE, Marysville, WA.).

Bellaire Airporter Shuttle: [1(800)423-4219 in Washington State only] OR (360) 380-8800 < <http://www.airporter.com> > will drop you off at the Marysville Best Western Hotel (between the Base and Smokey Point Complex). If trying to reach the Smokey Point Complex, when making your reservation, you can ask Airporter to drop you off at the Smokey Point Hawthorne Inn (about 1 1/2 miles from the Complex). From either the Hawthorne Inn or Marysville Best Western, you'll need to secure other transportation to travel the rest of the way to the support complex (13910 45th Ave. NE).

Public Bus transportation is available via Everett Transit at \$1.50 each way. The bus pick-up and drop-off at Naval Station Everett is just outside of the Base main gate. For more information regarding Everett Transit (times/fares/etc.) and the City of Everett, visit the web site at <http://www.everettwa.org/>. Cab service is available in the area. There is an Enterprise Car Rental in Everett (425-355-9218) that will deliver a rental car to you at the Base. There is an Enterprise car rental in Smokey Point (360-657-4512) that will deliver a rental to you in the Smokey Point area (Navy Lodge, Navy Gateway Inns and Suites).

Please note: there are other lodging facilities and car rental companies in the area accessible through telephone Information or the web. If traveling under orders, contact your nearest CTO/SATO first.

After receiving orders, you should start preparing for your household goods shipment. That begins at the Defense Personal Property web site < <http://www.move.mil> >. If you plan to move some or all of your household goods yourself, you can get paid at 95% of the government contracted rate of authorized weight. If you want to determine approximately how much the government will pay you to do this, you need the weight and the distance to be shipped (the results of the attached **Weight** calculator and Time/**Distance** calculator (below) are to be considered estimates). If you do decide to move your household goods yourself, go to the Defense Personal Property System (DPS) web site at www.move.mil. Also, make sure your belongings are properly insured.

Secretarial Process: If you need to petition the Secretary of the Navy through the Secretarial Process < <http://www.defensetravel.dod.mil/site/faqsec.cfm> > to dispute a PCS action/entitlement, please read this. Specific Retirement considerations can be found in the JFTR U 5130, Separation = JFTR U 5125. You may be using the NAVPERS form 1306/7 http://www.public.navy.mil/bupers-pc/enlisted/community/nuclear/Documents/1306_7.pdf which is an enlisted personnel action request called a "Thirteen-Oh-Six" and it is either submitted by your Career Counselor or leading Personnel Specialist in Admin. The form is used for virtually every kind of personnel request you want to make to "Big Navy". Want to change ratings? Want a spouse co-location? Want to split your tour? Adjust your PRD? Your command submits a 1306. If it's rating related, see your Command Career Counselor. If it's another type of personnel action, see your Admin LPO. Officers use the NAVPERS 1301/85 http://www.public.navy.mil/bupers-npc/reference/forms/NAVPERS/Documents/NAVPERS%201301-85%20R9-10_re.pdf . Another form is the form DD 149 < <http://www.dtic.mil/whs/directives/infomgt/forms/eforms/dd0149.pdf> >. Though it's main use is to correct errors in a service record, it has a much broader base of applications.
